

FotoFocus Announces 2024 Biennial Program and Opening Events

Celebrations Begin September 26, 2024, with Guided Tours, Talks, and Conversations with Artists including Barbara Probst, Ming Smith, and Filmmaker Michael Almereyda, Opening Receptions, and a Symposium with Keynote Speaker Kathy Ryan

(Cincinnati, OH – August 20, 2024) — **The FotoFocus Biennial** returns for its seventh edition with 107 projects across 86 venues, the largest edition to date. Taking place throughout October, the Biennial will kick off with an **Opening Weekend Program from September 26–28**, featuring celebrations and special programming events across the Greater Cincinnati Region. FotoFocus is pleased to welcome **Kathy Ryan**, the longtime director of photography at *The New York Times Magazine*, as the Keynote Speaker for the Biennial Symposium during the opening weekend. A pioneer of combining fine art photography and photojournalism, Ryan has invaluable insights into the industry and her expertise aligns with this year's Biennial theme of *backstories*. Referencing past experiences and histories untold, the projects and exhibitions as part of *backstories* fill in blanks and reclaim narratives, whether personal, historical, or political, providing essential context for art and images.

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"The Opening Weekend Program, and all the conversations and experiences that are part of it, is at the heart of what we do at FotoFocus," says **FotoFocus Artistic Director and Curator Kevin Moore**. "We are honored to have Kathy Ryan join us as the keynote speaker, along with so many participating artists, to bring these stories to life."

Engaging photography and lens-based art projects will be presented at museums, galleries, schools and universities, theaters, nonprofit cultural centers, parks, hotels, and libraries, among other venues throughout Greater Cincinnati, Dayton, Columbus, and Northern Kentucky. ABOUT FOTOFOCUS

FotoFocus is a Cincinnati-based nonprofit arts organization that champions photography and lens-based art through exhibitions and public programming. Since 2010, the organization has engaged art and educational institutions throughout the region to support and expand the cultural dialogue around the medium that has come to define our time. With an emphasis on intellectually and academically rigorous programs, the organization provides uniquely enriching access to lens-based art, film, and practices inspired by photography. FotoFocus has collaborated with organizations, curators, academics, and more than 2,600 artists and participants, to present over 750 exhibitions and programs.

Signature FotoFocus programming includes the **FotoFocus Biennial**, most recently held in 2022 with the theme *World Record*. Past editions have presented work across the Cincinnati region by historic and contemporary artists, including Berenice Abbott, Eugène Atget, Baseera Khan, Karl Blossfeldt, Francis Bruguière, Zanele Muholi, Tony Oursler, Wendy Red Star, Thomas Ruff, Ian Strange, and Akram Zaatari. Other landmark events include the **FotoFocus Symposium**, which has contributed significant dialogue and insight to culturally relevant topics including the controversial Mapplethorpe exhibition, and the **FotoFocus Lecture and Visiting Artist Series**, which has brought globally renowned artists such as Zoe Leonard, William Wegman, and Roger Ross Williams to Cincinnati.
